court formally modifies it. Parents who assume that payments automatically adjust when income, parenting time, or expenses change may find themselves out of compliance with an order that remains legally binding.

"Many parents believe that a raise, a job loss, or a shift in the parenting schedule automatically resets what they owe or receive, and that is not how the process works in Florida," said Jay Henderlite, Managing Partner at Sasso Guerrero & Henderlite. "An order stays in place until a court changes it. Understanding that difference is the foundation of sound child support guidance and helps parents avoid arrears or disputes that could have been prevented."

In evaluating a requested modification, the firm reviews the terms of the existing order, current financial information for both parties, the parenting arrangement as it stands, and the nature and significance of the changes that have occurred. This assessment helps determine whether a change qualifies as substantial, material, and permanent under Florida standards, which is the threshold generally applied when a court considers whether an adjustment is warranted.

"Every situation is examined on its own facts," Henderlite said. "The goal is to look closely at what has actually changed and whether that change is significant enough to support a request. From there, parents can make informed decisions through the appropriate legal process rather than relying on assumptions."

The firm notes that pursuing a modification through proper channels protects both parents and, most importantly, the financial interests of the child. Parents considering a request are encouraged to understand the standards that apply before an obligation is changed.
